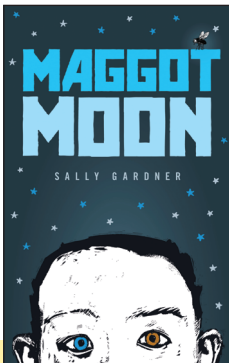

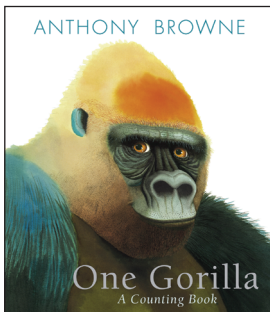
## **Maggot Moon** by Sally Gardner

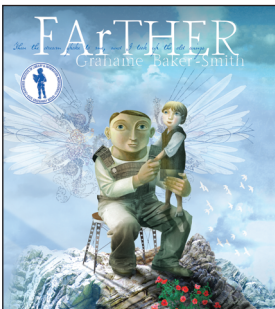
## **One Gorilla: A Counting Book** by Anthony Browne

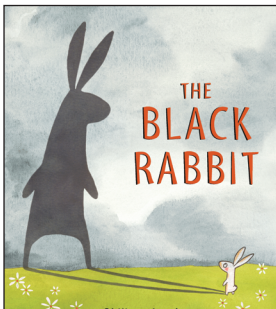
**FaRThER** by Grahame Baker-Smith

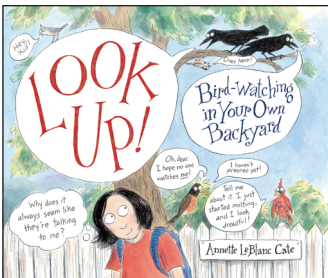
***The Black Rabbit*** by Philippa Leathers

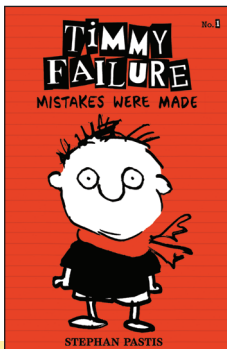
## **Zebra Forest** by Adina Rische Gewirtz
