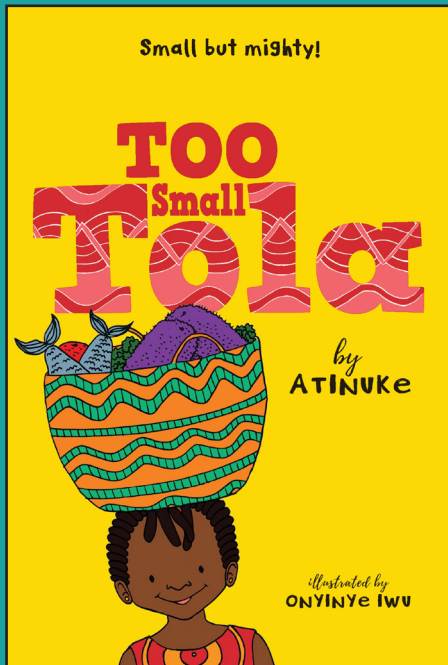

TOO SMALL TOLA

- Do you think Moji and Dapo should have helped Tola and Grandmommy with the market shopping in the first story?

- Provide examples of Tola trying to prove herself from each story. Why do you think she repeatedly feels the need to prove her strength and abilities to her siblings?
- Tola and her sister, Moji, have to wait in line and pump water outside, then carry it back to their apartment (page 37). What else did you learn about Tola's life in Nigeria? How is it different from your life?
- Tola is upset when others make fun of her for being so small, but she still manages to help people. What are some examples of Tola's bravery?
