- How does Anna feel when she is blamed for eating all the sweets? What did her family do to correct their mistake? Can you remember a time when you were blamed for something you didn't do? What happened?
- When Anna's female relatives volunteer to take her shopping, her grandmother makes them change their clothes. What do you think of this decision?
- How does each gift Anna's family give her demonstrate their love for her?
- Anna Hibiscus wants to tell her family she loves them, but they are all too busy. How does her family make it right before she leaves for her trip? How does her family show Anna that she is loved and that they will miss her? What did she misunderstand about why everyone seemed too busy for her? Were they too busy for her after all?



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
